### *WORLD REPORT ON VIOLENCE AND HEALTH (WHO 2002)*

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The report is the first comprehensive review of the problem of violence on a global scale – what it is, whom it affects and what can be done about it. Three years in the making, the report benefited from the participation of over 160 experts from around the world, receiving both peer-review from scientists and contributions and comments from representatives of all the world's regions.

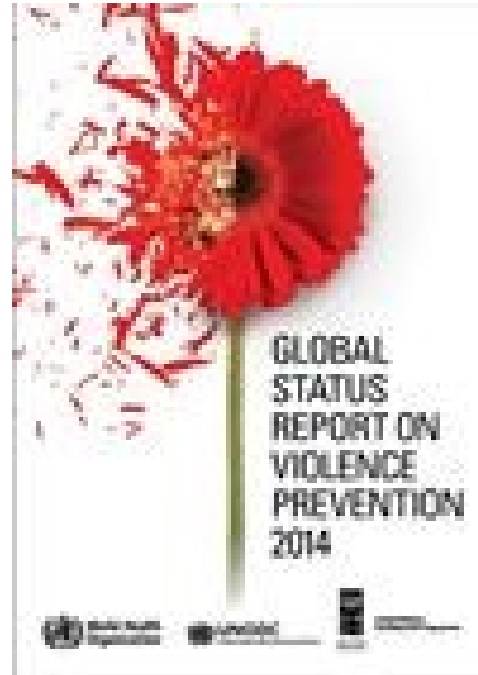

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### *GLOBAL STATUS REPORT ON VIOLENCE PREVENTION 2014 (WHO 2014)*

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This report reflects data from 133 countries and is the first report of its kind to assess national efforts to address interpersonal violence, namely child maltreatment, youth violence, intimate partner and sexual violence, and elder abuse.
